I created a form that displays the results in another html page but the @ sign is displayed as %40 in the new page. This is my code below. Can someone help out? `<script type="text/javascript">`

%40 is the URL-encoded version of @. This conversion only takes place in the URL. The server will still see it as @, and if necessary you can even use JavaScript to decode it:
