Compressed-air-energy storage (CAES) is a way to store energy for later use using compressed air. At a utility scale, energy generated during periods of low demand can be released during peak load periods.

Flywheels and Compressed Air Energy Storage also make up a large part of the market. The largest country share of capacity (excluding pumped hydro) is in the United States (33%), followed by Spain and Germany.
