Telecommunications in Jamaica include the fixed and mobile telephone networks, radio, television, and the Internet.

Calls from Jamaica to other NANP nations, such as the U.S. and Canada, are dialed as 1 + NANP area code + 7-digit number. Jamaica has a fully digital telephone communication system.

Jamaica follows its own national regulations via the Spectrum Management Authority (SMA), not strictly CE or FCC standards. UHF allocations in Jamaica include bands such as 902-928 MHz, which are ...

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
